Public Open House for Public Transportation Feasibility Study

Tuesday, Aug. 29 | 6:30-8:30 p.m. **City Hall Council Chambers**

The City of Moore is kicking off a Public Transportation Feasibility Study to evaluate opportunities for publicly accessible transit services in Moore. This process began in June 2023 and will be complete in April 2024 with opportunities for public input throughout. The first public open house for the study will be held from 6:30 pm. to 8:30 p.m. on Tuesday, August 29 at City Hall in the City Council Chambers. This is an opportunity for the public to give feedback on challenges, needs, and opportunities for transit in Moore, helping to further define project priorities. There will be no formal presentation and participants can come and go from the meeting as their schedule allows.

The primary goal of the study is to determine the viability of public transportation in Moore, and if feasible, develop recommendations to implement new services. The process will include public and stakeholder engagement, a statistically-valid survey, the identification of multiple alternatives for transit service, and the development of organizational and operations plans, a financial plan, and recommendations for regional connectivity.

Input received through the public participation process will guide the development of alternatives for implementing public transportation. Several options will be reviewed for applicability in the City of Moore. These include but are not limited to flexible and micro-transit options, the expansion of existing demand response services available to senior and disabled populations, the extension of existing nearby fixed-route services, new fixed-route service, and express service along I-35. Evaluation of potential alternatives will consider the numerous benefits and drawbacks of each and rely heavily on feedback from stakeholders and the Moore community.

The City has hired Olsson Engineering to lead this study, with a survey to be conducted by ETC Institute.
