Important Information About Your Drinking Water

MOORE PUBLIC WORKS AUTHORITY DID NOT MEET MONITORING REQUIRMENTS

Our water system recently violated drinking water requirement pertaining to the contaminant(s) of concern below. Although none of these violations are considered emergencies, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we are doing to correct this situation. Customers are not at risk and there is no reason to suspect any potential adverse health effects. Alternative water supplies are not needed.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water meets health standards. During the following monitoring periods, we did not monitor or test for the following contaminants and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of your drinking water during that time:

What happened/What is being done?

Concerning Water Wells #28 & #36: Well #28 was sampled for nitrates on 9/15/22 and the sample was delivered to a contract laboratory, however, the sample was not run as requested. Also, a sample was delivered for nitrates on 12/5/22 and was marked off of the Chain of Custody Form due to the sample exceeding the holding time. As for Well #36, the SOC sample was not collected due to the well being out of service for repairs. Samples were taken later, once we were made aware of the issue, and the water wells were in compliance. We will continue to take samples in the future as required.
