June 6th (7:00-8:00 pm)

- **Monty Harper**, an award-winning children's singer-songwriter, performs throughout the Midwest. His audiences can be counted on to laugh, clap, sing, wiggle, shout, roar, giggle, jump, hoot, pop, and snap!
- **Zoom City** (8:30pm-10pm)
This classic rock band is rooted in rich traditions, but has the versatility to cover the best of the new. With a song list that includes everything from Motown to Santana, there is something for everyone in a Zoom City performance.

June 13th (7:00-10:00 pm)

July 3rd (5:00-10:00 pm)

- **Bad Monkey**, rocking the Metro for years, features several Moore citizens who spin an exciting, classic brand of rock-and-roll.
