Moore Police Department Offering Motorcycle Safety Course

On Saturday September 20, 2008 from 9 am -3pm, the Moore Police Department Motorcycle Unit will conduct a civilian motorcycle safety class. This class will be presented at The First Baptist Church in Moore located at 301 NE 27th street.

Civilian Motorcycle Safety Survival Training is an effort to make city streets and highways safer for all. The Moore Police Department has initiated and implemented a motorcycle safety course designed to teach the motorcycle operator how to survive in traffic.

Due to the rising popularity of motorcycle riding and the dramatic increase of motorcycle occupant injury and death, members of the MPD motor unit are seizing the opportunity to instruct and protect metro motorcycle operators by offering this course. Riders will be taught techniques and skills utilized by our motorcycle officers to remain safe while enforcement riding.

Riders must have their own Motorcycle (Minimum of 250 cc. and street legal), proof of insurance and a valid Drivers License with M endorsement. Other restrictions apply.
