Nov. 8 Sales Tax Extension Election



The City of Moore will hold an election November 8, 2022, asking voters to consider extending the existing ½ cent sales tax. If approved, the revenue would be used for the following: 70% Residential Street and Residential Collector Street Repair, 20% Public Safety Machinery and/or Equipment and 10% Public Safety Operations. The timeline for the extension would begin April 1, 2023 and expire March 31, 2027. If approved, the City sales tax would remain at 3.875%. During the current four-year cycle we have been able to purchase 21 police vehicles, one fire engine and other equipment used daily by our police and fire departments. We have also spent over \$14M on residential streets.
