Nov. 8 Sales Tax Extension Election



The City of Moore will hold an election November 8, 2022, asking voters to consider extending the existing ½ cent sales tax. If approved, the revenue would be used for the following: 70% Residential Street and Residential Collector Street Repair, 20% Public Safety Machinery and/or Equipment and 10% Public Safety Operations. The timeline for the extension would begin April 1, 2023 and expire March 31, 2027. If approved, the City sales tax would remain at 3.875%. During the current four-year cycle we have been able to purchase 21 police vehicles, one fire engine and other equipment used daily by our police and fire departments. We have also spent over \$14M on residential streets.

Fire Department Achieves ISO 1 Rating

The City of Moore is proud to announce that the Moore Fire Department, in cooperation with the Water Department and Emergency Communications Center was awarded a Class 1 Public Protection Classification (PPC) rating by the Insurance Services Office (ISO). This is an accomplishment that less than 1% of the nation's Fire departments achieve and as of September 1, 2022, the Moore Fire Department is one of 8 departments in the state of Oklahoma to achieve the prestigious rating of 1.

City offices will be closed Nov. 24–25. Thursday trash collection will run on Wednesday, Nov. 23. Friday trash collection will not be affected.


The Station Recreation Center will be closed Thursday, Nov. 24, and open regular hours on Friday, Nov. 25 from 5 a.m.-10 p.m.

WHAT IS CALLER ID SPOOFING?

Spoofing is when a caller deliberately falsifies the information transmitted to your caller ID display to disguise their identity. Scammers often use familiar, local numbers to make the incoming call look like it's coming from a local individual, company, or a government agency that you may already know and trust. They use scripts to try to steal your money or personal information, which can be used in fraudulent activity.

If you receive a call of this nature try to obtain as much information as possible from the caller, giving them NO personal information, and then contact the Moore Police Department's non-emergency line at 405-793-5171 to report the incident.
