G.O. Bond Proposition for Street Improvements Special Election, November 14



PROPOSITION "Shall the City of Moore, Oklahoma, incur an indebtedness by issuing its bonds in the amount of Forty-Nine Million Three Hundred Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$49,390,000) to provide funds for the purpose of constructing, reconstructing, improving or repairing streets or bridges in said City, to be owned exclusively by said City, and levy and collect an annual tax, in addition to all other taxes, upon all the taxable property in said City sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as it falls due, and also to constitute a sinking fund for the payment of the principal thereof when due, said bonds to bear interest at not to exceed the rate of 7 per centum per annum, payable semiannually and to become due serially within 20 years from their date?"

The specific projects for which at least seventy percent (70%) of the proceeds of the aforesaid street or bridge bonds shall be expended, and the dollar amounts for each such project shall be as follows:

Q: If approved, will this raise my property taxes?

A: The City is committed to keeping the millage rate at or below 16.5 mills for the City's portion of property taxes. Bonds are issued in increments to ensure the millage rate is at 16.5 mills or less. An increase or decrease would be determined based on past/future millage rates that fluctuate based on total assessed valuations each year. Again, the City of Moore is committed to keeping our portion at or below 16.5 mills.

Q: Is this one proposition or is each project voted on separately?

A: This is one proposition which includes all projects. These projects are spread out throughout the city, among all 3 wards.
