Pet waste contains high levels of nutrients, particularly nitrogen and phosphorus, which can negatively impact water quality. When pet waste enters water bodies such as lakes, ponds, or creeks, it contributes to nutrient loading, leading to eutrophication.

Excessive nutrients can stimulate the growth of algae, leading to algal blooms that deplete oxygen levels in the water when they decompose. This decrease in oxygen can harm aquatic life, causing fish kills and disrupting the balance of the ecosystem.

Additionally, pet waste can introduce pathogens and bacteria, posing risks to human health. Picking up pet waste is important for maintaining water quality and ecosystem health.
