Is Your Pool Secure?



With the warmer months just around the corner, many of us are prepping our pools for the season. While we focus on chlorine levels and pool toys, the most important “accessory” is your perimeter fence.

Safety is a collective responsibility. To ensure your property is secure for family, friends, pets, and neighbors, please make sure your pool area meets these three critical safety standards:

- **Barrier Height:** A minimum of 4 feet in height to prevent unsupervised access.
- **Self-Closing Gate:** The gate should swing shut automatically after every use.
- **Self-Latching Mechanism:** The latch should engage on its own to keep the gate locked tight.

It only takes a moment to check your gate, but that moment could save a life. Let’s make safety the priority this summer. Taking a few minutes now to inspect your fence and gate can prevent tragic accidents later. Together, we can keep our community’s children and pets safe around backyard pools.

Summer Swim Lessons

While bridge construction is in progress, installation of new storm drainage systems, retaining walls, and concrete paving continues. Work is also being completed at multiple intersections, tying the new roadway into existing streets along with new traffic signal lights being placed at the intersection of Broadway and SE 4th St. Construction of the new water reservoir and pump station is expected to begin in the coming months that will actively drain the rainfall runoff from the low point of the underpass once it opens to the travelling public.

A project of this scale requires a large degree of coordination between local, state, and federal agencies, including the BNSF Railroad, ODOT, a local contractor, local engineering firm and the City of Moore. Though minor delays have occurred, dedicated teams from each entity working towards the same goal, the project has seen consistent progress, focusing strongly on safety and quality, leading to a final product matching the high standards we expect in Moore. This project is currently slightly greater than 50% complete and on track to be completed in early 2027. We thank the citizens of Moore for supporting the project by voting for the funds to construct the project and we look forward to soon enjoying the benefits of a safe and much-needed railroad crossing improvement.

This month, I asked Assistant City Manager Jerry Ihler to update us on one of the larger projects he is overseeing, the ongoing Railroad Underpass Project on SE 4th Street, between Broadway Ave and Tower Rd.

This project is designed to alleviate traffic congestion and eliminate conflicts between vehicles & trains at the railroad crossing. To date, the local contractor has successfully implemented the shoofly (railway detour), demolished the old crossing, and begun installation of the drilled shaft foundation to allow construction of the new railway bridge and eventually a pedestrian bridge across SE 4th Street.
