Shelter Welcomes New Superintendent

The City of Moore is excited to introduce our new Animal Welfare Superintendent, Stephanie Adams-Hawkins. Stephanie brings over a decade of experience in animal care and welfare, including leadership roles in zoo, sanctuary, and municipal shelter environments. Most recently, she worked for Norman Animal Welfare.



Stephanie has served as Sanctuary Manager at the Oklahoma Primate Sanctuary, overseeing daily operations and the care of more than 100 primates, along with staff, volunteers, and compliance efforts. She also has experience in budgeting, operations, and adoption programs, and holds multiple certifications, reflecting her commitment to high standards, transparency, and community-focused service.

Moore Animal Welfare, which is part of the Public Works Department, has 14 employees, which Stephanie oversees. She has already started making impactful changes, one of which is bringing back and growing the foster program. Those interested in fostering a shelter animal must:

- Be over the age of 18
- Complete an application
- Authorize a background check
- Agree to at-home visits by staff
