Special Election November 3, 2026

PROPOSITION: ½ CENT SALES TAX RENEWAL

Consider the renewal of the existing ½ cent sales tax. The revenues generated will be allocated as follows: 70% Residential Street and Residential Collector Street Repair, 20% Public Safety Machinery and/or Equipment and 10% Public Safety Operations. Passage of this proposition would not raise the sales tax rate. The current rate of 8.5% would remain the same.

PROPOSITION: \$18M GO BOND FOR DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS

Consider approving \$18 million in general obligation bonds to construct, re-construct, improve or repair streets, bridges and drainage. Identified projects are:

- NE 20th and Lincoln
- Rambling Oaks Drive
- Sooner Drive, north of SE 34th (design and initial construction)

Passage of this proposition would not raise the City's portion of the millage rate above the current cap of 16.5 mills.
