Water Conservation Reminder

The City of Moore and surrounding communities have implemented Progressive Water Conservation Stages. Mandatory odd/even watering (Stage 1) is now permanently in effect.

How does odd/even watering work?

If your address ends in an even number like 1400, you can water on even-numbered calendar days such as the 2nd, 4th, 6th and so on.

If your address ends in an odd number like 1401, you can water on odd-numbered calendar days such as the 1st, 3rd, 5th, etc.
