Public Safety, Parks and Recycling on Nov 8th Ballot

On Tuesday, November 8th the voters of Moore will be asked to consider TWO propositions:

1 Renewal of Temporary ¼ cent Sales Tax for a new Fire Station/ Fire Training Center and Parks Improvements

In November 2012 the voters of Moore approved a temporary ¼ cent sales tax for improvements to Moore parks. That tax will end, unless extended by the voters of Moore, on March 30, 2017. The Moore City Council has placed on the November 8th ballot a proposition to extend that tax for 4 more years. The City Council is proposing that the tax be used for public safety and continued improvements to our park system.

Specifically, 50% of the temporary sales tax would fund construction of a new fire station and fire training center to replace the existing fire station #2 on 12th Street. The remaining 50% of the temporary sales tax would fund improvements to Moore's existing park system.

2 Implement a Curbside Recycling Program

Also, the Moore City Council placed on the November 8th ballot a proposition to add a curbside recycling program to the Moore solid waste program. Each utility customer would receive bi-weekly (every other week) recycling service. The cost to each customer would be \$3/month. If approved the service would be implemented in 2017. Proposed service would be a single stream service similar to other metro-area cities.

Public Meetings to discuss these propositions will be held: October 24th at Winding Creek Elementary (1401 N.E. 12th St.), October 25th at The Station at Central Park (700 S. Broadway), and October 26th at Oakridge Elementary (3201 S. Santa Fe).

Now Open at Buck Thomas Park, 1903 NE 12th Street. The park is closed from dark until dawn. There is a Small Dog Area for dogs up to 30 pounds. The Large Dog Area is for dogs over 30 pounds. The park features shade areas, water access, play structures, walking trail, and doggie dispensers. Dogs must be in general good health and wearing current rabies tag. Grass Clippings in the Street



Fallen leaves and grass clippings can plug storm drains, flooding our roads and harming our creeks. When grass clippings and too many decomposing leaves are put in our streams, unnaturally high levels of nutrients can harm aquatic wildlife.

For best results, keep the mower blade sharp and mow only when the grass is dry. Grass clippings are a free, high-nitrogen fertilizer. When clippings decompose, they release their nutrients back to the lawn. They contain nitrogen, potassium and phosphorous, as well as lesser amounts of other essential plant nutrients.

What we do on land affects our storm water. If it's on the ground, it's in your water. Please do your part and help keep it clean.


Little River Trail of Fears Presents: CarnEvil
