Put a Freeze on Winter Holiday Fires

It's fun to decorate for the winter holidays, but holiday decorations can increase your risk for a home fire. As you deck the halls this season, be fire smart.

- Read manufacturer's instructions for the number of light strands to connect.
- 2 out of 5 home decoration fires are started by candles.
- The top 3 days for home candle fires are Christmas, New Year's Day and Christmas Eve.
- Keep candles at least 12 inches away from anything that burns.
- Although live Christmas tree fires are not common, when they do occur, they are dangerous. On average, 1 of every 31 reported Christmas tree fires resulted in death.
- A heat source too close to the Christmas tree causes 1 in every 4 of the fires.
- Make sure your tree is at least 3 feet away from heat sources like fireplaces, radiators, space heaters, candles or heat vents.
- Get rid of your tree after Christmas or when it is dry.

City Offices will be closed Monday, December 26th in observance of Christmas.



Oil & Stormwater Don't Mix

Oil does not dissolve in water. It lasts a long time and sticks to everything. Oil and other petroleum products are toxic to people, wildlife and plants. One pint of oil can make a slick larger than a football field. The small drips and leaks of oil from our cars and trucks accumulate on our roads, driveways and parking lots and when it rains it's washed into our streams, rivers and lakes. Used motor oil is the largest single source of oil pollution in our waters. Americans spill 180 million gallons of used oil each year into our waters. A single quart of motor oil can pollute 250,000 gallons of drinking water. Here are some tips to prevent oil leakage:

- Stop drips. Check for oil leaks regularly and fix them promptly. Keep your vehicle tuned to reduce oil use.
- Use ground cloths or drip pans beneath your vehicle if you have leaks or are doing engine work. Clean up spills immediately. Collect all used oil in containers with tight fitting lids. Do not mix different engine fluids.
- Never dispose of oil or other engine fluids down the storm drain, on the ground or into a ditch.
- Recycle used motor oil. Many auto supply stores and gas stations will accept used oil.
