**Times scheduled for recyclable items:**


Paper Shredding: 8:00am – Noon

## FLOOD ZONE AWARENESS



With spring weather quickly approaching, make sure to be aware of areas of potential flooding in or near your home. Protect your home with flood insurance; know what your insurance covers and your property's flood risk. An approximate 30 day waiting period occurs from date of insurance purchase before our policy goes into effect. Go to [floodsmart.gov](http://floodsmart.gov) for more information.

**During a Flood:**

1. Go to higher ground away from areas subject to flooding
2. Avoid areas already flooded. Just 6" inches of moving water can knock you off your feet
3. Never drive through flooded roadways, as they may be washed out under flood water

# Severe Weather Season Approaching

Springtime in Oklahoma means the possibility of severe thunderstorms. Prepare your family now by having a means of receiving factual, no-hype weather information, rechecking your preparedness supplies, and ensuring that you have a place to shelter from Oklahoma winds.

Moore's Emergency Management staff monitors weather information on a daily basis. We utilize multiple sources of current information and you should do the same. These might include local TV and radio, NOAA weather radios, smartphone apps, and of course our outdoor warning sirens. Our favorite websites include our local NWS office [www.weather.gov/norman](http://www.weather.gov/norman) and the Oklahoma Mesonet [www.mesonet.org](http://www.mesonet.org).

Moore sirens are silently tested every morning; audibly tested on Saturdays at noon (when the weather is nice); and are activated for warning whenever tornadic conditions are directly threatening the City of Moore. You might have heard Oklahoma City sirens activated at other times in the past; they have changed their policies this year and should come closer to being sounded at times similar to ours.

We're happy to assist with programming of your weather radio! Be sure to give us a call at 793-4477 before you come to the Emergency Operations Center so we can be here to assist you.



There are no public storm shelters in Moore or surrounding communities. If your home is equipped with a storm shelter, that's where you should go every time the sirens sound. If you don't have a shelter, take cover in the lowest, most interior room of your home. If you choose to leave and shelter elsewhere, be sure to leave well before the storms threaten.

There are no current shelter assistance programs in Moore. We have used all of the funds received in our previous program, which assisted more than 1,600 residents.
