



Are You Covered for Sewer Backups?

Be sure your home owner's insurance policy covers damage due to a sewer backup. Even if a backup is due to a blocked City main, the City may not be allowed to pay for damages. Under State law, cities are liable for sewer main backup damage only if there has been prior notice and time to fix the problem.

Although City crews can help clean up the immediate mess, home owners, not the city, must pay for replacing carpets, furniture and repairs.

Another sewer backup safeguard is to install a check valve. This simple device keeps wastewater from flowing back up your private line into your home. (Check valves are now required on some newer homes).

Improvements to the City's sanitary sewer system have reduced backups considerably in recent years. That doesn't mean much if it happens in your house.

CALL AHEAD!!! Call us 24 hours a day at 793-5080 if you have signs of a developing backup. Signs of blockage include: slow draining sinks, wastewater back flow and/or continuous sewage smell.

If there's a problem with the City line, we should be able to fix it before sewage backs up into your house. If your private line is blocked, we'll inform you so you can get it fixed.


City Offices will be closed on Monday, September 5th for Labor Day. Trash Service will not be affected.

Stormwater Savvy: How to Drain Your Swimming Pool Safely



Swimming pool water often looks clean, but can contain chemicals, like chlorine, algae and bacteria that can kill fish and plants that our creeks need to be healthy. Here is how to safely drain your pool to protect our wildlife:

1. Pump the pool water into the public sewer system through your sanitary sewer clean-out.
2. If you don't have a sewer clean-out, then, take your time and let the water drain **SLOWLY** into a grassy area far away from the street and any drainage channels or creeks.



DO NOT drain pool water to the street or dump it into a creek or drainage channel. It's not good for the environment, and it is also **ILLEGAL!** Be Stormwater Savvy and protect our natural resources.

Over fertilizing is a problem contributing to stormwater pollution. Without realizing it, many landowners are applying fertilizers and pesticides when their lawns don't even need them!

When applying fertilizer, it's important to know when it is needed and when it is not in order to avoid the excess fertilizer from entering the storm drains and negatively affecting water quality.
