



- Nickel Cadmium (Ni-Cd)
- Nickel Metal Hydride (Ni-MH)
- Lithium Ion (Li-Ion)
- Nickel Zinc (Ni-Zn)
- Small sealed lead (SSLA/Pb)

- PVC

### #4

- Cling wrap
- Sandwich bags

### Other items include:

- Regular batteries, car batteries, wet-cell batteries, incandescent light bulbs, fluorescent light bulbs, electronics, needles or syringes, oil, shredded paper, glass, yard waste, appliances, bubble wrap, coat hangers, food waste, tires, waxed cartons, wood, or hazardous waste.

## WHAT TO DO WITH HAZARDOUS WASTE

To encourage proper disposal of hazardous household waste, the City of Moore has contracted with OKC to use their facility:

- Under 7.5 gallons: 1 free monthly pass per household; more than once per month: \$39.50
- Between 7.5-15 gallons: \$79.00
- Between 15-22.5 gallons: \$118.50
- Over 22.5 gallons: \$158.00
