Stormwater Spring Cleaning



Spring rains funnel runoff down paved surfaces and into storm sewers that carry it to our waterways, which can impact our drinking water and native marine wildlife.

Doing a few simple things can help us protect our waterways this spring.

- Remove pet waste and trash from streets, sidewalks, and driveways and put it in the garbage.
- Remove debris such as trash, leaves and grass clippings away from catch basins, drainage ditches and waterways whenever you see it.
- Whenever possible, use environmentally friendly, biodegradable products when cleaning outside.
- **DO NOT** dump household waste such as paint, cleaning products, motor oils, antifreeze and other hazardous materials into catch basins, drainage ditches and waterways.
- **DO NOT** apply lawn care products to frozen ground – wait until the grass starts growing.

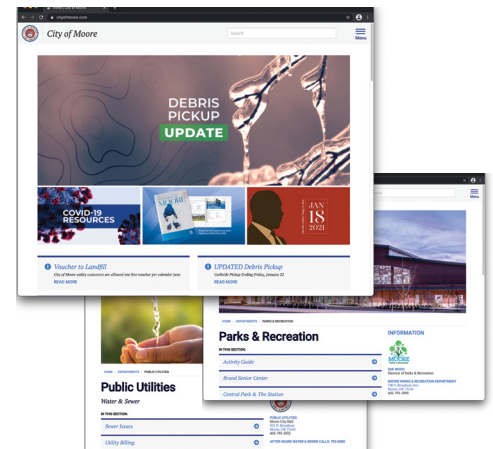
