NEW BUSINESS

(A) CITIZENS TO BE HEARD

There were no citizens present to speak.

(B) ITEMS FROM THE PARK BOARD

Board Member Robinson commented that he read the information distributed at the last meeting and it was very good. Chairman Payne added that the Strategic Plan is a great document to submit for CAPRA accreditation and would provide a good overview of the city's Parks and Recreation department for new Park Board members.

Sue Wood, Parks and Recreation Director, asked what the board thought of the PATH 2030 addendum, noting that the only projects not completed from the PATH 2022 Master Plan were Old Town Park and Quail Ridge Park.

Chairman Payne recalled that Quail Ridge residents weren't happy about soccer fields being constructed there due to concerns about bright lighting at night shining into the neighborhood. Sue stated that since then all of the practice fields and parking areas have been put in and the residents are excited about it; there are also plans for a playground and a sprayground to be constructed there.

Agenda Item Number 5 being:

REPORTS

- Sue spoke on the expansion of the Central Park maintenance yard; fencing will also be added.
- The Buck Thomas maintenance yard will be expanded to the grassy area; chain link fencing will also be added.
- Fencing will be constructed around the Central Park playground. Vice Chairwoman Mattocks asked about the height of the fence. Sue responded that it will be a 4-ft fence, to the west of the sidewalk, to keep kids inside for safety reasons.
- The Buck Thomas Park bathroom construction at baseball begins this week. The contractors will update all electrical issues with the lights, install heating in the bathrooms so pipes don't freeze in the winter, and install ADA accessible stalls.
- There was a fire in the cemetery to the west; no damage reported.
- Registration for Oasis Summer Camp and Aquatics swim lessons open on February 9. The first day of camp registration will be for last year's returning campers only.
- The Station is hiring for summer jobs including camp counselors, lifeguards, aquatic attendants, and concessions attendants.

PARKS BOARD MEETING-MINUTES

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Sue added that the City Council proclaimed February 13 as United Acts of Kindness Day. Sponsored by First United Bank, they will try to complete one million acts of kindness through the help and generosity of their employees and other organizations, businesses, etc.

Vice Chairwoman Mattocks asked if there is any information on increasing the City sales tax. Sue responded that the City Council has authorized it to be put on the ballot for voting, adding that an increase in sales tax will help decrease the use of bonds. Chairman Payne asked if the tax will replace bonds. Sue responded that it won't replace bonds but will reduce the need to use bonds, adding that most of the usage of the property taxes is from the Moore Public Schools system, Moore Norman Technology, and Cleveland County. She added that she will invite the city manager to the next Park Board meeting to provide information on the one-cent sales tax proposition.

ADJOURNMENT

Vice Chairwoman Mattocks motioned to adjourn the regular meeting of the Moore Parks Board; second by Board Member Robinson. Motion passed unanimously.

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
