Community Emergency Response Training



The CERT program educates people about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster skills such as fire safety, light search and rescue and disaster medical operations. This training will be provided by members of our Fire Department, Police Department, EMSTAT and Emergency Management. Using CERT training learned in the classroom and during exercises, individuals can assist others in their neighborhood, workplace or school following an event when professional responders are not immediately available to help.

Naturals for the training are neighborhood watch, community organizations, communities of faith, school staff, workplace employees and other groups that come together regularly for a common purpose, but individuals not affiliated are welcome to learn the skills that are useful in disaster and everyday life.

Class is a total of 20 hours and will be held on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 6:30–9:30 p.m. starting April 5 and ending on April 21.

What is Stormwater Runoff?

It is the rain and melting snow that flows from streets, rooftops and lawns. The flowing water carries salt, sand, oil, pesticides, fertilizers, leaves and grass clippings, oil, litter and many other pollutants into nearby waterways. Each of us contributes to stormwater pollution and each of us can stop it. Here are some ways you can help:

- Keep pesticides, oil, leaves and other pollutants of streets and out of storm drains.
- Divert roof water to lawns or gardens where it can safely soak in.
- Clean up pet waste—bury it or flush it down the toilet.
- Keep cars tuned up and repair leaks.

The amount of pollution that you can stop may seem small, but together it all adds up to cleaner water for everyone to enjoy.
