Open Thursday, December 26th: 5 a.m.–10 p.m.




PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

- Applicant must buy a home in one of the Targeted Funding Areas within the City of Moore
- Applicant must not exceed current income guide lines for their family size
- Must have ability to get a 1st Mortgage either through a bank or mortgage company
- Homebuyers must provide minimum funds equal to 1% of sales price as your commitment to buying the house
- Homebuyers must have 3 months principal and interest payments in a savings account at closing
- Buyer must occupy the purchased property as their primary residence for the five-year affordability period
- Must attend a certified Homebuyer Education Workshop prior to closing
- Property must be owner occupied or vacant for three (3) months if previously rented to anyone except the buyer
- Property must pass a City Inspection prior to closing
- Maximum purchase price: \$138,000 existing - \$180,000 new construction
- Ends in December 2019

Rental and Utility Assistance Program

Central Oklahoma Community Action Agency provides emergency rent and utility assistance to low-income individuals and families.

Assistance only pays for one month's billing cycle. Assistance may only be provided once in a 12-month period. If a utility has already been cut-off, COCAA is not able to assist. To contact COCAA and check eligibility for assistance in Cleveland County, please call 405-701-2170.



Oklahoma's New Firearms Carry Law

HB 2597 was passed by the legislature and goes into effect November 1, 2019. The new law drops the SDA requirement for certain persons to have a license to carry a firearm. The new law also allows members of the military who are 18 or older to carry a firearm without a permit/license.

People who have been convicted of domestic abuse charges, convicted of felonies, or adjudicated as having a mental illness are still not allowed to carry a firearm.

Also it should be noted the term "pistol" was dropped from the new law, and replaced with "firearm". Essentially this means a person can now carry a loaded rifle, shotgun, or pistol on their person.

Businesses can still restrict access to their property when someone is carrying a firearm. Schools and government buildings are also off-limits to a person carrying a firearm.

Simply carrying a firearm in public does not warrant law enforcement intervention. Once officers have determined that no law is being broken, no further action will be taken by law enforcement officers.
