Big Trash Pick Up

Each residence is allowed two free big trash pickups per calendar year. To schedule a big trash pick up call 405-793-5070.

Vouchers to the landfill located at 7001 S. Bryant Ave., Oklahoma City, OK 73149 are available for pick up at Customer Service at City Hall. Each City of Moore customer is allowed one free voucher per year.

Requirements:

1. When using the City's Big Trash Service, residents are reminded to not place items out until the weekend just before your scheduled pickup. Big Trash Items placed too soon at the curb may violate the City Code for trash/litter and possibly public nuisance.
2. Place Big Trash items within 10' of the curb.

3. Items should be placed as close to the curb as possible, not under tree branches, electrical wires, or any other overhead obstruction and should not be placed on top of water meters.
5. A city crew will be by to collect those items at some point during your pick up week.
7. Please do not cover your water meter box with large trash items. This delays or prohibits the meter reader from determining the water used for utility billing.
8. For residential customers only.

Prohibited Items:

Tires, Batteries, Paints, Oils, Gases, Household Chemicals, Freon units, Shingles

The 2020 Census: Deadline is October 31st

The U.S. Constitution requires that each decade we take a count—or a census—of America's population. The 2020 Census goal is to count everyone once, only once, and in the right place. The census provides vital information for you and your community.

- It determines how many representatives each state gets in Congress.
- Communities rely on census statistics to plan for a variety of resident needs including new roads, schools, and emergency services.
- Businesses use census data to help provide more local jobs and places to shop.

Each year, the federal government distributes hundreds of billions of dollars to states and communities based on U.S. Census Bureau data. In 2020, we will introduce new technology to make it easier than ever to respond to the census. For the first time, you will be able to respond online, by phone, or by mail. We will use data that the public has already provided to cut down on household visits. And, we are building a more accurate address list and automating our field operations—all while keeping your information confidential and safe.

If You Can't Call, Send a Text to 911

If you need help and can't speak on the phone, use your mobile device to send a text message to 911.

SENDING A TEXT TO 911 IN AN EMERGENCY IS SIMPLE AND QUICK.

1. Open a new text message on your mobile device.
2. Type 911 in the recipient field.
3. Type the location of the emergency and indicate whether you need police, fire, or medical assistance and then hit "SEND."

The 911 dispatcher will reply with instructions or questions. Please respond as promptly as possible to ensure the fastest response from emergency responders

Voice calls to 911 will always be quicker, so
CALL IF YOU CAN, text if you can't.
