Road Construction Project Updates

PROJECT: SE 4th Street Railroad Underpass (Broadway Ave. to Tower Dr.) Includes Pedestrian Bridge over the Top of the Underpass

Current Schedule: 60% Preliminary Plans submitted end of July 2019 to City for Review

90% Final Plans to be submitted tentatively in December 2020

Bid Package to be ready for Construction tentatively in May 2021

Status: City staff is reviewing the preliminary plans



PROJECT: SW 34th Street Bridge/ I-35 Overpass Includes Bridge over I-35, a Bridge over low water crossing east of I-35 and access roads connecting SW 34th Street to both I-35 Service Roads

Current Schedule: Construction Began in August 2018 and Roadway is tentatively scheduled to be open to traffic in October 2019

Status: Installing Traffic Signals at Intersections and Fencing on I-35 Overpass

PROJECT: SW 34th Street Widening & Reconstruction (Telephone Rd. to Santa Fe Ave.)

Includes three Phases:

- 1.) East of Sendera Lakes Entrance to Telephone Rd.
- 2.) West of Sendera Lakes Entrance to Santa Fe Ave.
- 3.) Santa Fe Ave. & SW 34th Street Intersection

Current Schedule: Phases 1 & 3 are tentatively scheduled to be complete late October/early November; Phase 2 tentatively scheduled to be complete in February weather permitting

Status: Project 20% Complete; currently working on Phases 1 & 3

PROJECT: The Curve (Replacing Affordable Housing Damaged in the 2013 tornado) Includes 244 Units – 90% affordable housing; 10% at market rate

3 buildings – 2 Multi-Family; 1 Mixed Use with Retail

Includes Open Space Green Belt Park Area

Current Schedule: Construction began in January 2019; Tentative Completion Date is December 2020 weather permitting

Status: Two Multi-Family buildings under Construction - Concrete Pads poured and Framing is ongoing; Installation of Water, Sewer & Storm Sewer is ongoing

PROJECT: Fire Station #2

Includes New 9,000 sq. ft. Facility capable of housing 2 Engine Companies; Replacing Existing 50 year old Structure and Relocating to provide Better Response Times to service area

Current Schedule: Construction began in Spring 2018; Tentative Move -In Date is early September 2019

Status: Working on Finishing touches, painting etc. and Parking

A Message from the Moore Animal Shelter

DID YOU KNOW?

If you are a resident of the City of Moore your pets are required to be registered with the City to show they are current on their Rabies Vaccine (rabies vaccine is required by state law for all pets over the age of 4 months old and must be administered by a licensed vet to be recognized legally). The Rabies Tag and City Tag are required to be worn at all times.

HOW DO I REGISTER MY PET WITH THE CITY OF MOORE?

To register your pet bring a copy of their current rabies certificate to the Moore Animal Shelter. You will receive a city license and tag for each registration and the cost is \$2.50 for each pet (We accept all forms of payment, but we require exact change when paying cash, as we do not keep cash on site at the shelter). This is an annual registration, but coincides with their rabies vaccine and will expire when the rabies expires if that date comes before

your annual renewal date. The process to register your pet is quick and you do not need to bring your pet with you to the shelter to register them.

WHY do we have registration for pets and what are the benefits? Most suburb cities require pet registration by law. It is the only way for us to know your pet has received and is current on their rabies vaccine. A rabies tag alone does not give us all the necessary information our officers need when they come in contact with an animal. We cannot always get in contact with the Vet Office listed on their tag to find out if their vaccine is current or if the tag belongs to the animal wearing it. When registered, all of your information, along with your pet and their vaccine information is entered into our database. This allows us to know they are compliant with City & State Laws and we would have the necessary information to get them home faster.

If unwilling to comply citations can be issued. In reference to Section 4-122 through Section 4-124
